Executive Summary

2011 was a year of excitement and growth for the Piscataway Public Library.

Sunday hours were continued, and we were able to add Saturday service at the Westergard Branch during the summer months. The Westergard Branch was the focus of two major projects, the renovation of the meeting room and the creation of the new Job Training and Teen Space which adds approximately 1,000 square feet to the busy branch. The library hired its first librarian focused on expanding library service to Generation X and Y.

Public computer usage continued to grow at both branches. The new public space at the Westergard Branch will increase the number of public computers available at the branch by 50%. The library was also included in a Broadband Technology Opportunities Program (BTOP) grant that provided expanded computer training opportunities for job seekers with instructors from Middlesex County Library.

The library has increased its focus on downloadable ebooks as usage increased 50% in 2011 from 2010. In September the addition of Kindle compatible downloads made this service even more popular. The library has also started to lend video games as well as electric usage meters.

Piscataway Public Library will continue to strive to provide the best library service to our community. We would like to thank all the people who support the library: the Township of Piscataway, the Friends of Piscataway Public Library, private donors, the library staff and the Board of Trustees. All of these groups have continued to demonstrate their strong commitment to providing the best library service to our residents.

Library Budgets

Budget Notes:

- •The Friends of the Library supplied \$10,421 for library programs to compliment the funding in the library budget.
- •The Friends of the Library provided \$6,149 for printing of the library newsletter. The Friends also supplied \$15,992 for books in 2011.
- •The Friends of the Library supplied nearly \$34,000 for renovations to the Westergard Branch.
- •Sunday hours continued and Saturday hours at the Westergard Branch in July and August were introduced.
- •Reduced spending on reference materials allowed increased spending on fiction and nonfiction materials. Fiction circulation increased 12% in 2011.
- •Library funding was reduced by 5.5% between SFY 2010 and CY 2011. Piscataway transitioned from a Fiscal Year Budget to a Calendar Year Budget.
- •Library Automation for CY 2011 represents half the annual cost due to the budget transition from the fiscal year.

Ebooks @ PPL

- Ebook Downloads increased by 350% in 2011.
- In February 2011, Piscataway Public Library joined the Advantage Program to supply more popular titles to our residents.
- In September 2011, Kindle format books were added to the library's subscription to Overdrive.
- The Piscataway residents now have access to over 4,000 ebook titles in a variety of formats.
- Piscataway residents downloaded 3,829 titles, audio books and ebooks in 2011, compared to 2,558 in 2010.

Westergard Branch



The Westergard Branch received two major upgrades in 2011. The well used community meeting room was renovated. The Friends of the Library supplied nearly 50% of the funding for this project.

In September 2011 the branch began renovating a former staff area to provide an additional 1,000 square feet of public space to be used for teens and job training. The new space is scheduled to open on February 4th, 2012.

Adult and Young Adult Services





- 257 Adult and Young Adult library programs were held at the Kennedy Branch in 2011. Attendance for the programs was 4,586, an increase of nearly 50% from 2010.
- In 2011, the library collected oral histories from local war veterans. The oral histories are now available on the library website.
- The Library Players presented The Prince Who Wouldn't Talk. The teens practiced throughout the summer to present two shows at the library. This year over 200 people attended the showings.
- The library hosted a Family Women's World Cup Event in 2011. Women's Professional Soccer Players of Sky Blue FC were in attendance as library users watched the U.S. Women's Soccer team defeat Korea DPR. Players signed autographs and had their pictures taken with attendees.

Adult and Young Adult Services (Continued)

- Traveled to the Piscataway Schools to booktalk to 24 classes, reaching over 1000 students.
- Created a book review blog, http://piscaya.blogspot.com/.
- Proctored 93 exams for distance learning colleges
- Delivered materials to homebound patrons.
- The library held two after hours programs for teens to play games, relax and eat.
- Hired a librarian to focus on providing services for Gen X and Gen Y

Outreach to Preschools

- Cove Point Foundation Grant The library received an \$11,000 grant for extended outreach. The library purchased kit materials and presented story times to 550 children at Children's Corner Preschool, run by the Piscataway Board of Education.
- The Children's Department staff visited area nursery schools and day care centers, presenting story times to 1,087 young children in the spring and 823 in the fall. The library also continued the Preschool Outreach Book Delivery to nursery schools and day care centers.

Outreach to Public Schools

- The Children's Department continued its partnership with Piscataway Senior Citizen and fifth graders, some with special needs, from Martin Luther King School with the Senior Reading Buddies program.
- 166 second graders from Eisenhower School walked to Westergard for a story time, game and a tour and the library issued18 new library cards.
- The library attended 2 Back to School nights this year, which were very successful. At Arbor School, library staff talked to 112 people and signed up 37 people for library cards. At King School, the library staff talked to 75 people and signed up 12 people for library cards.

Gaming at the Library





- On November 12th, the library hosted a National Gaming Day program at the Kennedy Branch. 44 children attended the event, where they played video games and board games throughout the afternoon.
- 525 kids participated in the Chess Club in 2011 for an average of 23 kids at each of the 24 sessions.
- In October 2011, the library hosted a Retro Gaming Day. Over 125 people came together in the Kennedy Branch meeting room to play games on older video game systems. This was an increase of 95 people from 2010.
- The library hosted two Library After Hours events in 2011. 38 teens were able to play Just Dance 2, ping pong and board games in the library meeting room and enjoy pizza and beverages.

Helping the Community in Need

- The library hosted quarterly blood drives sponsored by New Jersey Blood Services. Over 200 pints of blood were raised in 2011. Each pint of blood can save up to three lives.
- Each branch of the Piscataway Library has an ongoing food drive through M.C.F.O.O.D.S. (Middlesex County Food Organization and Outreach Services). Piscataway Public Library collected approximately 11,000 lbs of food and hygiene products in 2011.



Special Populations






- Piscataway Public Library utilized the ALA grant, "The American Dream Starts @ Your Library," to offer citizenship classes from September 2010 to June 2011. A number of the program's attendees have now achieved U.S. citizenship.
- The library continues to offer Gaming for Children with Special Needs. 284 people participated in the program.
- In 2011, the library made 28 material deliveries to homebound Piscataway residents.
- The library made 10 visits to the senior center and Sterling Village in 2011.


Volunteers

- In Children's Services 19 volunteers donated 133 hours at Kennedy Library during the school year.
 97 junior library volunteers, 54 at Kennedy and 43 at Westergard, helped the library run the Summer Reading Club, donating 1,537 hours to the library this summer.
- 316 hours were completed by S.A.I.L. Volunteers in cooperation with the Piscataway School District.
- The library also benefitted from nearly 120 hours of volunteer time from Rutgers Library School students.






























2012 Goals
