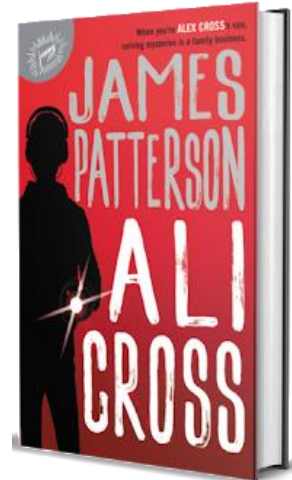


Ali Cross
